

MT. HOOD & COLUMBIA RIVER GORGE REGION

"THE INFINITY LOOP"

Welcome to your magical journey along The Infinity Loop in the Mt. Hood and Columbia River Gorge region of Oregon. The Infinity Loop route makes for the perfect road trip in the region, ensuring you don't miss any of our best sights. Your adventure will take you in and out of lush green forests, through bountiful orchards and vineyards, along the Historic Oregon Trail, up Oregon's tallest mountain, and past sparkling rivers and streams. There are endless (one might even say infinite) adventures and experiences waiting for you, starting just 20 miles east of Portland. What are you waiting for? Take a few days and come explore for yourself.

HOW TO SAFELY ENJOY YOUR STAY

- Visit mid-week and/or head out early to avoid crowds.
 - Wear a face covering, when required.
 - Wash or sanitize your hands often.
- Maintain a minimum 6ft distance from others, when possible.
- Plan before you leave home. Trail closures can happen without notice.
- Avoid crowding in parking lots and have a Plan B in case a trail is full.
- Take your trash with you when garbage bins are full or not nearby.
 - Be mindful and avoid risky behavior on the trail.

WEST COLUMBIA GORGE AREA

From Troutdale to Cascade Locks you will be in awe of the natural and historic wonders this area possesses. Check out the King of the Roads Barn Museum to learn about America's first Scenic Highway, the Historic Columbia River Highway. Tour Bonneville Dam and marvel as scores of salmon make their way up the fish ladders. Don't miss an overnight in Cascade Locks for good beer, bronze art, and fresh fish from one of the tribal fish markets in town. All along the way enjoy basalt cliffs, eagles and ospreys, and numerous waterfalls.



HOOD RIVER VALLEY

Hood River is the Columbia River Gorge's basecamp for outdoor adventures and agricultural abundance. Revel in seasonal produce and epic views of Mt. Hood as you eat your way through the Hood River Fruit Loop. Stop at one of the dozens of wineries in the valley and enjoy a taste of what this varied landscape has to offer. Take a step (or flight) back in time with a visit at the Western Antique Aeroplane & Automobile Museum (WAAAM). Don't miss a bike or hike along the Historic Columbia River Highway State Trail to experience the Twin Tunnels and Mosier.



THE DALLES AREA

The Dalles area is steeped in Oregon heritage and dramatic high desert landscape. Learn about the tribal and pioneer histories at the Columbia Gorge Discovery Center & Museum. Visit the oldest bookstore in Oregon, Klindt's Booksellers & Stationers. Stay the night and wake up to spot bald eagles roost at The Dalles Dam each winter. Cast off on the Columbia or Deschutes rivers in search of walleye and bass. Don't miss the Historic Oregon Trail as it passes through Dufur on its way toward Mt. Hood.



MT. HOOD TERRITORY

From the top of Mt. Hood to the Clackamas River, Mt. Hood Territory offers a multi-day outdoor scenic beauty adventure. Family fun can be found year-round at our ski resorts like cosmic tubing in the winter and summer mountain biking. Wildwood Recreation Site offers the perfect outdoor getaway from it all. Don't miss Estacada, along the banks of the Clackamas River. Here you can view over 20 murals in town and float or paddle the river! Just keep your eyes peeled for a bigfoot sighting.
